1           5. Based upon a weighted-ER analysis, I estimate that the three winning candidates received  
 2 the three highest shares of Latino votes (by point estimates). As estimated by weighted-ER, approx-  
 3 imately 70% of Latino voters cast ballots for Mr. McKeown; approximately 63% of Latino voters  
 4 cast ballots for Mr. Morena; and approximately 62% of Latino voters cast ballots for Ms. Himmel-  
 5 rich. Those three candidates are also estimated to have received the highest share of African-  
 6 American and White votes (again by point estimate). These results are set forth in the below figure:



 14           6. I obtained the voting data for this analysis from the Los Angeles County Regis-  
 15 trar/Recorder's "Official Statement of Votes Cast" for the City of Santa Monica in the November 6,  
 16 2018 election. The data collected include the total number of ballots cast and the number of votes  
 17 cast for each candidate in each voting precinct. I merged this information with data on voter registra-  
 18 tion by race and ethnicity downloaded from the Statewide Database, which is the official database  
 19 used by the State of California for redistricting. In particular, the Statewide Database tabulates the  
 20 number of voters whose surnames appear on a list of Chinese, Filipino/a, Indian, Japanese, Korean,  
 21 Vietnamese, and Latino/a surnames to approximate the number of Asians and Latinos/as who were  
 22 registered and who voted in each precinct in a given election. I imputed the fraction of registrants  
 23 and voters who were African American and white using data from the Census's American Communi-  
 24 ty Survey (these data were also obtained from the Statewide Database). Although the Statewide Da-  
 25 tabase's ethnic breakdowns of registrants by precinct are not yet available for the November 2018  
 26 election, they are available for the June 2018 primary election, which I used to perform my analysis.  
 27 It would be preferable to base the weighted-ER estimates on the ethnic composition of those in each  
 28 precinct who voted in the November 2018 election rather than on the composition of those who were

1 registered in each precinct. However, based on my experience, my professional opinion is that it is  
2 highly unlikely that either the estimates presented above or the conclusions drawn from those esti-  
3 mates are materially affected by the use of the Statewide Database's demographic data for June 2018  
4 registrants rather than the forthcoming demographic data for November 2018 voters. For this reason,  
5 I have confidence in the results of my analysis.
