FUND STATUS



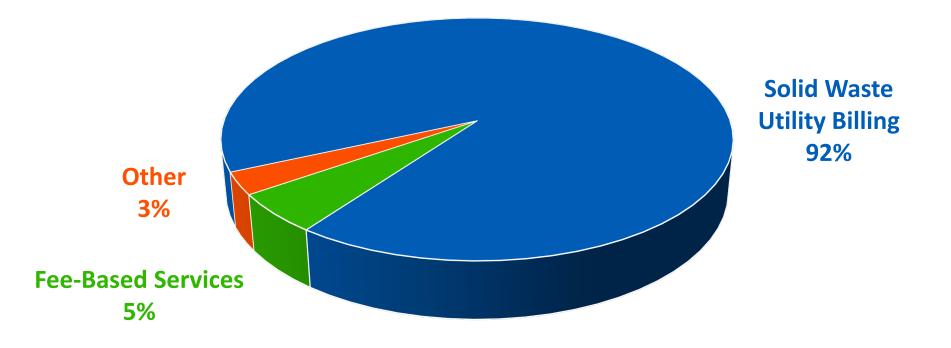


ENTERPRISE FUND

- Operates like a private enterprise: Revenues must cover expenses
- Independent from the General Fund
- Historically a very healthy fund
- Rate study is required every five years to set rates
- 2014: Last adopted rate study
- 2019: Began a new rate study, but unable to continue due to COVID-19

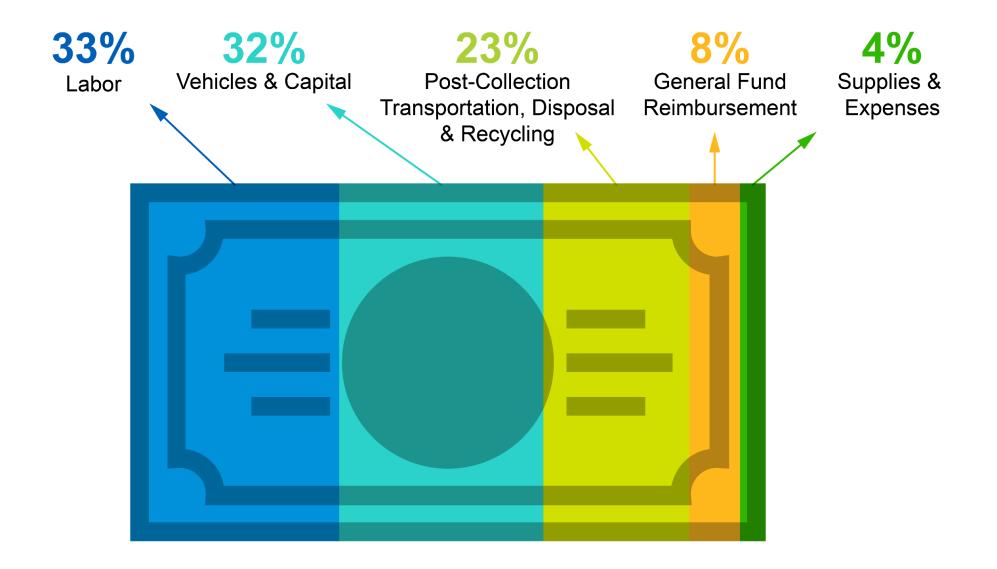
WHERE DOES RRR REVENUES COME FROM?

- 2019 rate study paused March 2020 with COVID-19 stay-at-home order
- Conscious decision to protect ratepayers and businesses
- Solid waste rates froze for three years (FY 2020-23)
- Three-year rate freeze + COVIDrelated revenue losses collided with skyrocketing inflation and increased cost of doing business

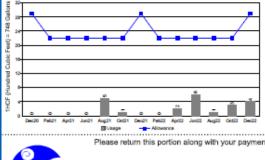

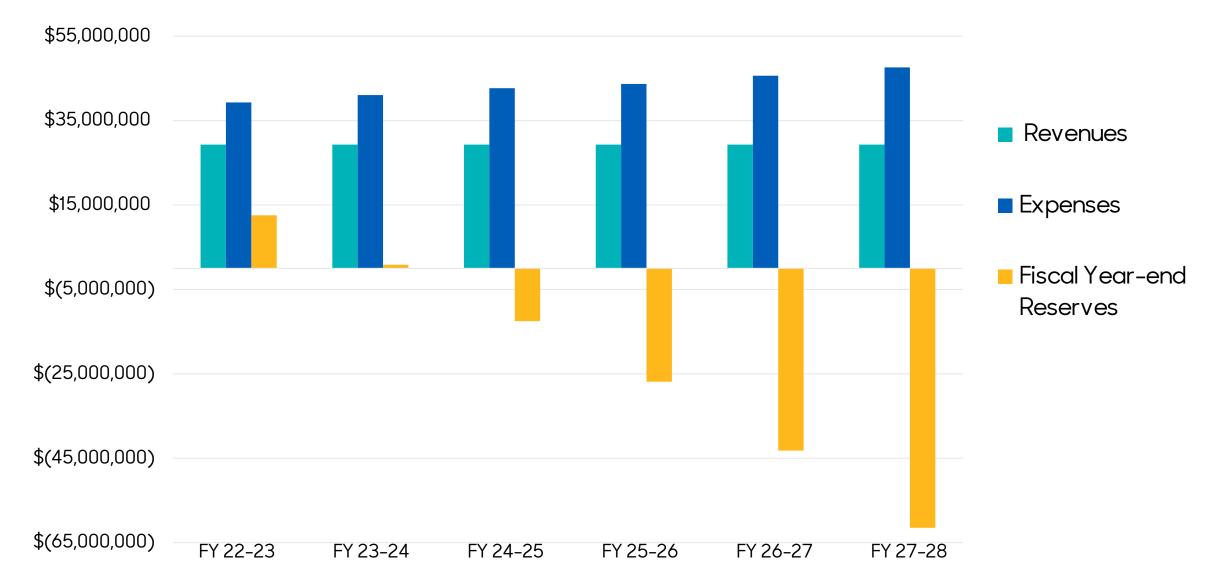


NO INCREASE IS NOT AN OPTION

- Even with no new added services or staffing, a minimum 9% annual increase would still be required to stabilize RRR Fund and reverse financial structural deficit
 - Staff does not recommend this:
 - Staffing shortages are unsustainable
 - Will lead to continued degradation of service and cleanliness

COMMUNITY BENEFITS

- Rate difference for Option One vs. Option Two is minimal (\$2 per month for many customers)
- Compare favorably with other cities
- Protect renters and rent-controlled buildings: Multifamily rates are still lower than other cities
- Protect businesses and economic recovery: Commercial rates are still among the lowest in LA County
- Better service, faster 311 response time, weekly alley cleanup, cleaner city, promotes volunteerism and sense of community

- City can create a solid waste rate discount program

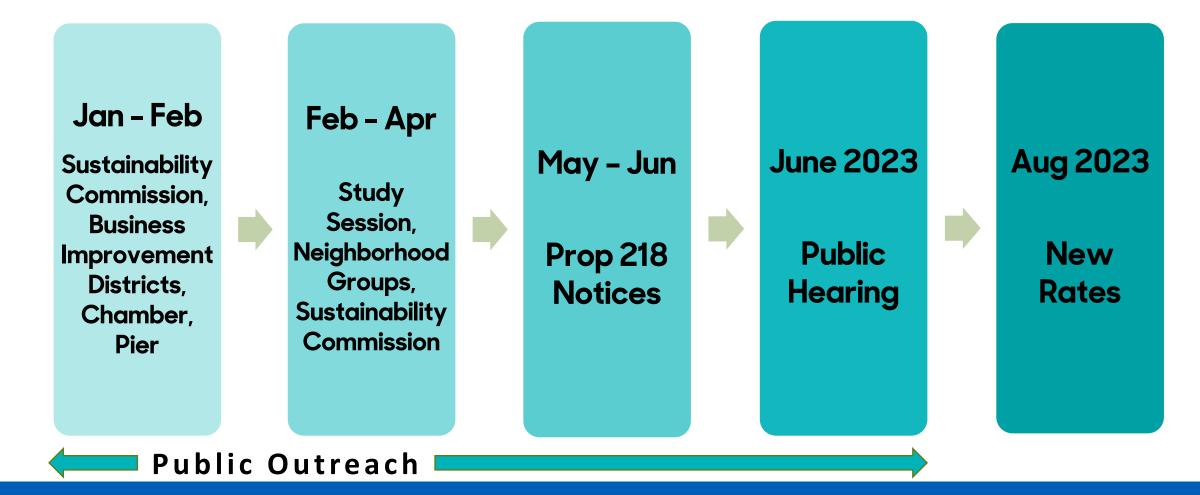
