

Hire additional sanitation workers to meet community needs and new recycling requirements



Modernize and simplify rate structure



Comply with California's NEW mandatory organics recycling law; buy and service more green bins



Build fund reserves following threeyear rate freeze during COVID-19



Proactively clean up alleys and collect abandoned bulky items on a weekly basis



IMPROVED: BULKY ITEM ILLEGAL DUMPING (BIID) RESPONSE TEAM

- One of the most requested 311 services in the City
- New proposed rates would allow RRR to hire more workers and expand the BIID team
- Intended Outcomes:
 - ✓ Cleaner, greener city
 - ✓ Less strain on 311 system





NEW: COMMUNITY CLEANUP PROGAM

- Make a difference in your own neighborhood!
- Supplies and hauling provided
- Intended Outcomes:
 - √ Volunteerism
 - √ Community-building

NEW: SOLID WASTERATE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- City has 444 California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) customers
- 64% of CARE customers: single-family and smaller multi-family
- PROPOSED:
 - CARE customers would qualify for water and solid waste rate discounts
 - Water discount: \$1 per hundred cubic feet in Tier 1 rate
 - Solid waste discount: 10% discount
