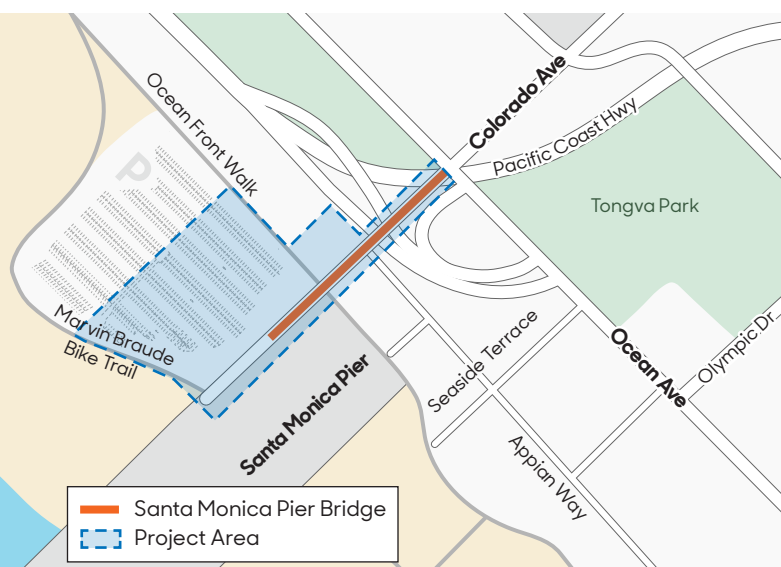
The Santa Monica Pier Bridge serves as the only vehicular access and a crucial pedestrian pathway to one of Santa Monica's top attractions, the Santa Monica Pier. Annually, it facilitates millions of visitors traveling from Palisades Park to the Pier and the beach. Constructed in 1939, this reinforced concrete bridge is owned by the City of Santa Monica (City).

Project Background

The primary purpose of the Pier Bridge Replacement Project is to replace the 86-year-old bridge and provide a seismically sound and functional bridge for residents, pier businesses, pedestrians, bikers, vehicles, and pier visitors. The new bridge will have wider (15') sidewalk on the south side of the bridge. The main objectives of the redesigned bridge is to:

- Improve vehicle and pedestrian safety
- Increase visitor access
- Preserve existing character and visual aesthetics
- Address structural deficiencies

The design and construction of the replacement bridge is to be primarily funded with Federal Highway Bridge Program (HBP) funding.



Project Timeline

City of Santa Monica City Council certified the Pier Bridge Replacement Project Final Environmental Impact Report in June 2023 and approved the preferred alternative bridge design. Final Design of the new Pier Bridge is complete.

Construction is expected to begin in late 2025 and last approximately 2 years, with construction estimated to be completed prior to the Los Angeles 2028 Summer Olympics.
