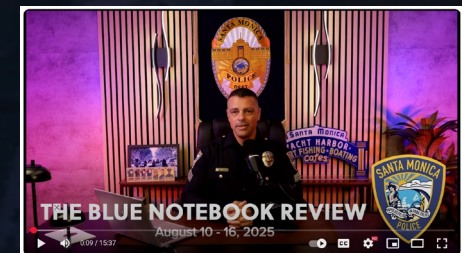

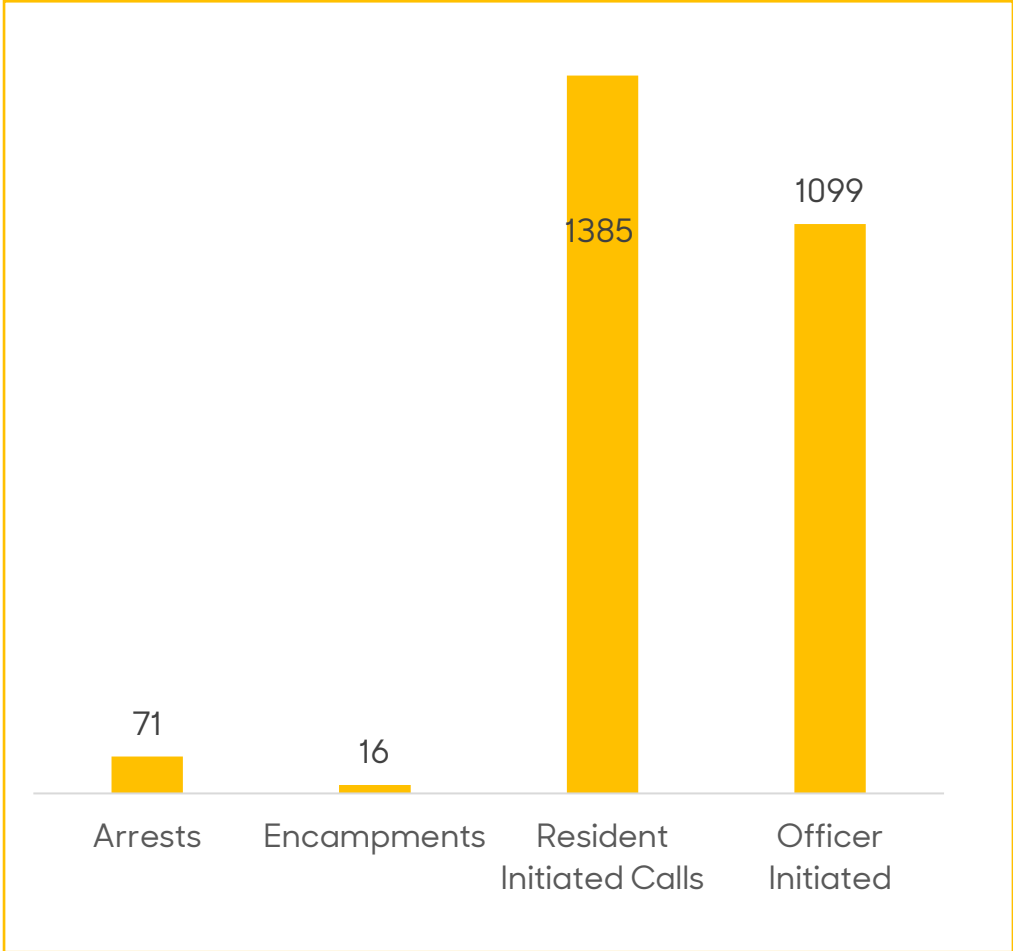

The Calls For Service report lists all the calls the Santa Monica Police Department received and entered into the Computer Aided Dispatch system during the 24 hour period specified (from midnight to midnight). The Calls For Service report lists (in order from left to right) the time each call was received, the time the call was completed, the incident number, incident type, address, reporting district, beat, and incident disposition.

The Arrest Report constitutes a list of all arrestees entered into the electronic booking system during the 24 hour period specified (from midnight to midnight). The Arrest Report lists (in order from left to right) the date each person was arrested, the time of the arrest, the incident number, the booking numbers, the case/incident number, the person's last name, first name, age, sex and race, and the primary charge. Fatal Hit-and-Run

A vehicle traveling westbound in eastbound lanes mounted the sidewalk, striking four pedestrians. Two victims died at the scene, two were hospitalized. The driver fled on foot. Investigators identified the suspected driver and associates. Case jointly investigated by MART and CID.

Location	Type	Narrative
1610 Wilshire Blvd (Target)**	Theft / 666.1 PC Arrest	Officers responded to a theft in progress. The suspect fled but was located nearby. Positive field ID and two prior theft convictions led to felony charges.
4th & Pico Blvd	Felony Battery on BBB	Two passengers on a Big Blue Bus fought; the suspect punched the victim, who used pepper spray defensively. Both treated by SMFD; suspect arrested.
Appian Way / Arcadia Ter	Concealed Firearm Arrest	Officers observed four subjects using inhalants near Lot 2 South. One fled on foot and discarded a loaded firearm during pursuit. S1 arrested; gun recovered.
1600 Blk Beach	Theft / Warrant Arrest	Harbor officers assisted PD in locating a suspect with stolen property. The individual was arrested on an outstanding warrant and transported for booking.
	Domestic Violence	Officers responding to a fight determined it was a domestic incident. Male suspect fled prior to arrival; investigation ongoing.

500 Blk Wilshire (CVS)	Estes Robbery	A known theft suspect forcibly resisted loss prevention. The suspect was arrested for robbery.
1422 3rd St Prom	Petty Theft / Juvenile	Known juvenile suspect fled ALO store after concealing items. Officers detained her a block away; she was cited and released to parents.
1251 4th St (TJMaxx)	Grand Theft / Narcotics	Chronic theft suspect arrested; search revealed narcotics hidden in a cast. Additional charge for bringing controlled substance into jail.
6th & Arizona	Warrant Arrest	Officers' consensual contact with a subject led to arrest for a no-bail 211 PC warrant out of Ventura County.
1300 5th St	Narcotics / Warrant	Known subject with a \$30K SMPD warrant located and arrested; meth pipe recovered.

The Homeless Liaison Program (HLP) team conducts Directed Deployment efforts at the start of each shift, focusing on specific areas throughout the city. Below is a summary of this week's activity.

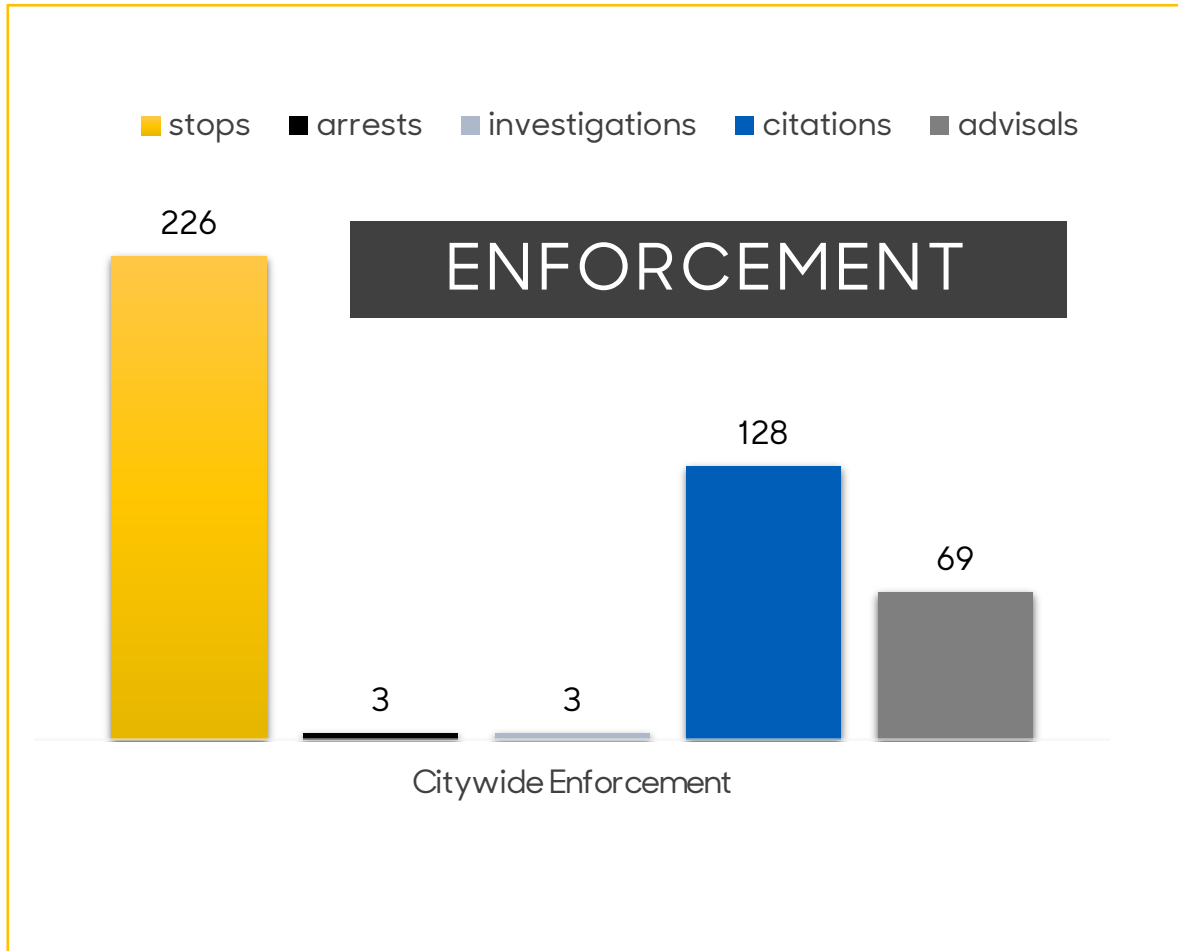
Directed Enforcement at VAP	Personnel issued 27 advisals, 18 citations, and 8 referrals to services
Project Homecoming	Officers assisted a homeless veteran in returning to Colorado through coordination with the Salvation Army and the VA Hospital. Transportation and lodging were arranged to ensure safe arrival.
Encampment Cleanup	Officers and City partners cleared a sidewalk encampment obstructing pedestrian access near the 900 block of Santa Monica Blvd. One elderly male was transported for medical care.
Reed Park Outreach & Service Connection	Officers conducted welfare checks and connected multiple unhoused individuals to SaMoBridge and temporary shelter resources.
Parolees at Large Palisades Park & Beach	Personnel arrested multiple parolees for drug possession, out of compliance sex registrations and drinking on the beach.

Location	Type	Narrative
Ocean / Bay	Felony DUI / Hit-and-Run	Follow-up from an earlier collision resulted in felony filings against the driver for DUI and reckless driving. Additional misdemeanor charges were filed for leaving the scene. Case referred to the DA's Office.
26th / Pico Blvd	Street Racing Collision	Two vehicles engaged in an illegal street race collided, causing significant damage. The case is pending filing. Both drivers identified.
1600 26th St	Vehicle vs Vehicle Collision (Injury)	A two-vehicle crash investigation revealed one driver was unlicensed, unregistered, and uninsured. The suspect was cited, and DMV notification completed.
Citywide	Traffic Enforcement Activity	Motor officers conducted focused enforcement in DTSM and school corridors.

Promenade Activity	Personnel provided a police presence at the Dodgers Pep Rally and the World Series Game #1 event on the Promenade, as well as a Block Rave Party in the 1200 Block of 3rd Street.

Upcoming Event Planning	Olympic Sub-Committee Meeting, Halloween Safety Messaging and Promenade Activations
Neighborhood Meetings	Officers participated in Mid-City meeting and provided a traffic safety update along with crime prevention tips for identified crime trends.
Robson & Maple Block Parties	Neighborhood engagement event promoting community-police relationships.



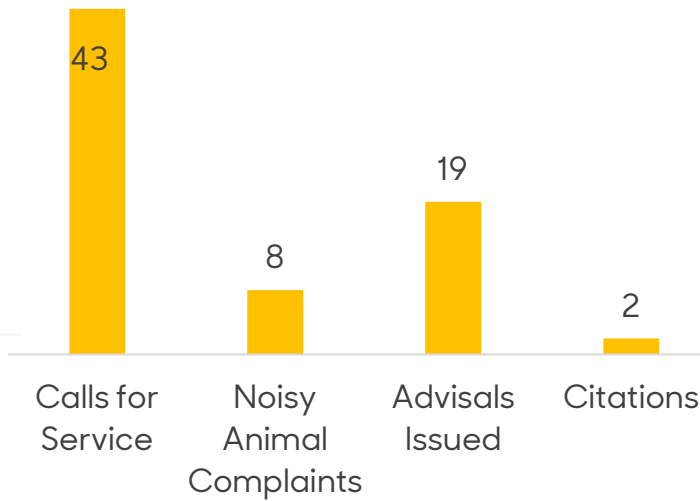
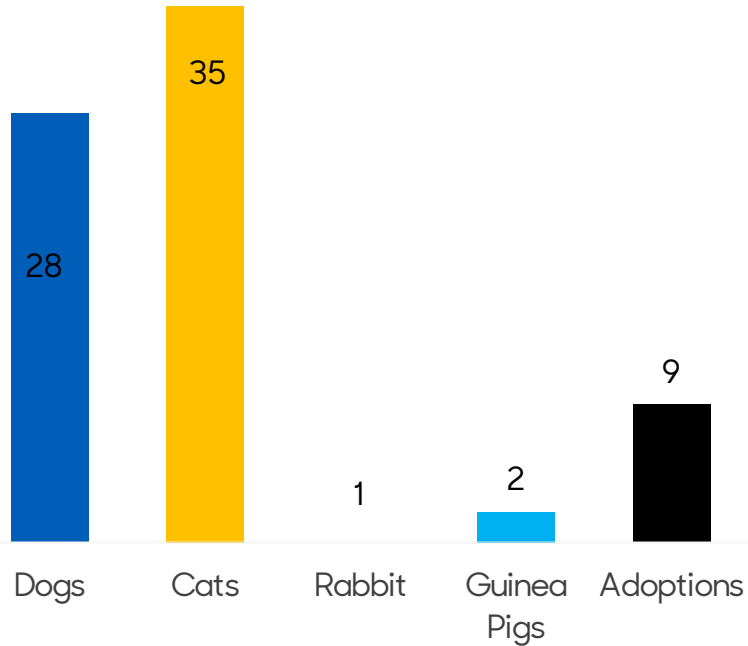
